Hurley Chief of Staff Donates Much Needed Medical Equipment to his Native Country

Dr. Elmahdi Saeed, Hurley Chief of Staff, recently purchased and donated three (3) Dialysis machines to a remote area in the northern area of Sudan, his native country. "People there were very grateful for these machines. Lots of patients in renal failure there really need this. Many people die because there just isn't this kind of equipment in remote parts of Sudan," said Dr. Saeed.

Dr. Saeed has seen many patients over the years need Dialysis because of Kidney Failure, but recently this impacted his own family. "One of my brothers needed dialysis. He was able to get treatment near Sudan's capitol. It is very different when it is your own brother going through something like this. It really can be difficult. So these machines were really a gift from my heart to the people of Sudan. I hope this inspires others to give" said Dr. Saeed. Dr. Saeed says right now there are over 30 doctors from Sudan working in Mid-Michigan. One of his brothers, Dr. Seif Saeed, MD, works at Hurley.

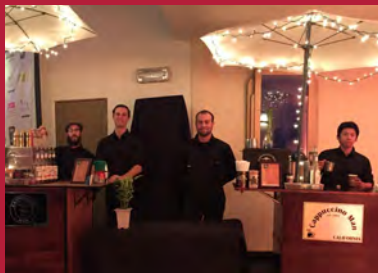

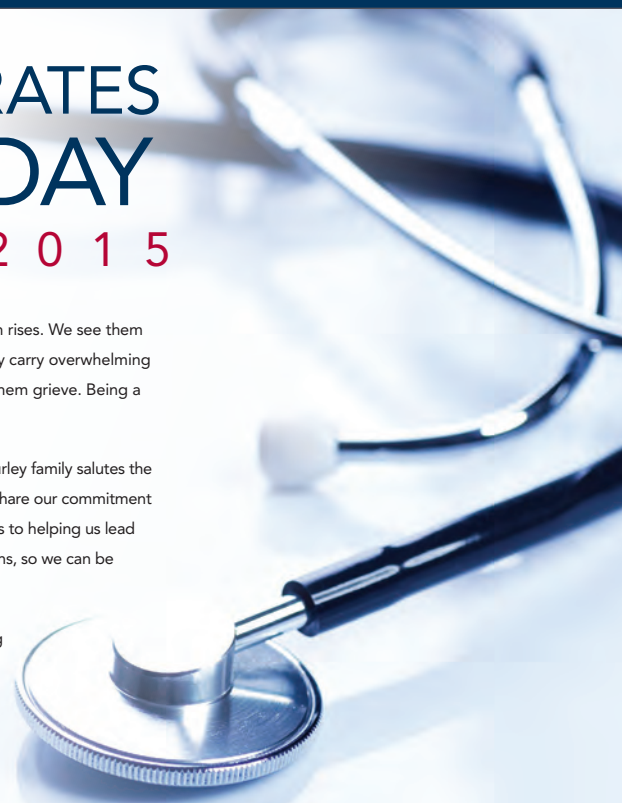
HURLEY CELEBRATES DOCTOR'S DAY

Hurley in the News ...

Hurley's Breast Cancer Nurse Navigator Wins Prestigious Award – February started out on a very positive note, as Hurley officially announced a big award for Breast Health Nurse Navigator, Marsha Schmit, RN, BSN, CBCN. She was named Oncology Nurse Navigator of the year by Breast Cancer Wellness Magazine, a national publication. Numerous media outlets picked up the story, including the Flint Journal. ABC12 sat down with Marsha to talk about the countless ways Breast Cancer Navigators help women and their families through their journey. From diagnosis to treatment to breast reconstruction to long-term follow up, Marsha is a caring, highly-trained registered nurse who gives one on one support to patients going through breast cancer treatment because she understands exactly what it is like to be in their shoes. Marsha has been a breast cancer survivor since 2009. She has helped over 700 women and their families navigate through their journey, providing them with medical and community resources for care and treatment, and beyond.

Measles Cases on the Rise – With the increase of parents choosing not to vaccinate their children, Measles outbreaks have been popping up all over the nation. ABC12 did a story with Dr. Brian Nolan, MD, clinical director of pediatrics at Hurley Medical Center and Dr. Dustin Miller, Pediatric Resident Physician at Hurley Medical Center about how many new doctors didn't learn a lot about treating Measles in Medical School. However, since it is becoming a more widespread disease again, doctors are bringing themselves, and their staff, up to speed.

Radiothon – On February 5th and 6th Hurley's West Lobby was bustling with miracle families and volunteers. WIOG "Cares for Kids" Radiothon filled radio airwaves with two solid fun filled, emotional days of how Hurley Children's Hospital has made a difference in countless lives. Many media outlets came to see the miracles in action, including ABC12 who went live from Hurley on ABC12 News at Noon. Those listening called in and donated \$71,065 for Hurley! That is a 16.5% increase over last year.

Governor's Blood Clot – On February 6th, Governor Rick Snyder was hospitalized with a blood clot after an Achilles injury. The Local media turned to Hurley for answers. Dr. James Weber, MD, Hurley ER Physician, spoke on ABC12 News at 5 about causes, treatment and prognosis.

34th Hurley Benefit Ball Press Conference – On February 22nd a press Conference was held in the Charles White Conference Center to introduce the 2015 Hurley Benefit Ball Ambassadors. We heard the amazing survival stories of Clarissa Ruffin and Jakeya Thornton and how Hurley Children's Hospital made a huge difference in their lives. 2 year old Clarissa, aka "Baby Rosie" spent 28 days in the hospital after dealing with a serious bout with Pneumonia. 18 year old Jakeya has been a regular in the hospital not only because she has been dealing with Diabetes for over a decade, but also because she is a volunteer in the Pediatric Unit. The Flint Journal, ABC12, WNEM 5, and NBC25 all did features on their stories. The 34th Hurley Benefit Ball will take place at the Riverfront Banquet Center in Flint on March 7, 2015. ... "I just would like to thank the doctors that didn't let me go home when I wanted to because I probably wouldn't have made it when I went home as I wanted to. So, they were thorough and did their job."

... "She was the lady doctor, E-l-s-e-b-t-h, and I can't pronounce her name. She was a very nice doctor. We've had very nice conversations. And my comments about Hurley, this is a beautiful hospital. One thing our patients feel we could have done better ...

... "I really like the hospital. I was born at Hurley and consider it to be my hospital, that's how I feel. But, what I think they could have done better is ask the patients questions about their care while they are in the hospital."

"What they could have done better was, told the patient exactly what date they were going home because when you are from out of town and don't have anything to wear or no one is at home and they tell you something different. Their needs to be an understanding with the patient and the discharge people."

... "When they notice that a patient is afraid of a certain procedure they should try to explain it a lot better to them so that it would ease their discomfort because I was very afraid and they did not explain the procedure to me enough."

Clinical Documentation

Importance of clarifying whether diagnoses are **PRESENT ON ADMISSION**:

A diagnosis cannot be the Principal Diagnosis, main reason for inpatient admission, unless it is present on admission. Please document if there is a "Possible" diagnosis (eg. possible sepsis) at the time of admission.

HOSPITAL ACQUIRED CONDITIONS (HACs) – Hospital quality scores are negatively affected and additional monies are not paid for certain medical conditions that occur during the hospitalization (were not present at the time an inpatient order was written). It is important to document these conditions in the H&P so there is clear documentation that the condition was PRESENT ON ADMISSION. HAC examples: pressure ulcers, catheter associated UTI, vascular catheter infections, etc.
